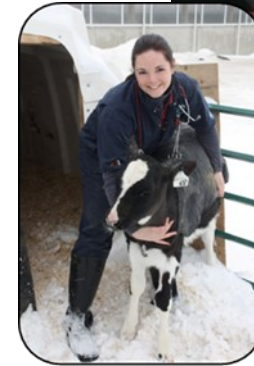

Who are we?

The Ontario Association of Bovine Practitioners (OABP) is a group of over 200 Ontario veterinarians with a passion for all aspects of the dairy, beef, and veal cattle industries. Elected volunteers from the profession serve as Directors and Executive members.

What do we do?

The OABP offers a variety of continuing education (CE) opportunities to provide cutting edge information to veterinary practitioners and veterinary students, and through them, to producers and industry personnel.

CE Meetings: Two CE meetings (spring and fall) for veterinarians. New CE initiative developed in 2013 for Veterinary Technicians in bovine practice.

Courses & Workshops: Milking equipment evaluation, laboratory techniques for the diagnosis of mastitis (partner with AHL, University of Guelph), ultrasound, and financial/management.

Training: ProAction, Johne's Risk Assessment and Management Program, mentoring of veterinary students in our practices, and research activities.

Educational Articles: Members contribute to Ontario Dairy Farmer and Ontario Beef Farmer magazines.

Newsletter for members: News from veterinary associations, research highlights, and member information.
